We use the modal verbs **can**, **could**, **may**, **would**, **will** and **shall** for requests, offers, invitations and permission. Study the table below.

	Use	Examples
can	to ask somebody to do something to ask for or give permission to offer to do something	Can you help me? Can I have another chocolate? Yes, you can use my laptop. No, you you can't use my laptop. Can I help you with your bags?
could	to ask somebody to do something to ask for permission <i>(more polite)</i>	Could you call me a taxi? Could I come to work a little later? Do you think I could borrow your phone?
may	to ask for or give permission <i>(polite)</i>	May I speak to you for a second? Yes, you may use my laptop. No, you may not use my laptop.
would you like	to make an offer or invitation	Would you like another chocolate? Would you like to go out?
will	to ask somebody to do something	Peter, will you come here for a minute?
would	to ask somebody to do something <i>(very polite)</i>	Would you carry my bags for me, please?
shall I ...	to offer to do something	Shall I answer the phone for you?
